Dr. Rodriguez Mercado is a native of Ponce, Puerto Rico and was appointed as Secretary of Health and Human Resources in January 2017. He is a professor of Neurosurgery at the University of Puerto Rico (UPR), School of Medicine and Director of the Endovascular Neurosurgeon and Stroke Center.

From the humblest beginnings in Mexicali, Mexico, Dr. Quiñones-Hinojosa worked to become an internationally renowned neuroscientist. Dr. Q serves as the chair of the Department of Neurologic Surgery at Mayo Clinic's campus in Florida, and he is recognized with the distinction of a named professorship, the William J. and Charles H. Mayo Professorship.

In addition to his clinical activities, Dr. Quinones-Hinojosa leads NIH-funded research to find a cure for brain cancer. His cutting-edge research focuses on brain tumors and cell migration, health care disparities and

clinical outcomes for neurosurgical patients in which the operating room is used as an extension for his research scenario.
